

Camp Hill Boys' School

- School rules apply to Sixth Formers
 - Uniform
 - AM attendance (afternoon study leave if no lessons)
- Sixth Form Block

Entry requirements

- At least five GCSE subjects at grade 6 or above
 - Mathematics at grade 6 or above
 - English Language at grade 5 or above
- At least a grade 7 at GCSE in those subjects they wish to study at A Level
- At least grades 8 and 7 in Core and Additional Science or Dual Award, where this is studied, in order to pursue any Science A Level
- Some subjects may be studied at A Level without a GCSE in that subject:

A Level Subject	GCSE requirement
Economics	7 in Mathematics
Psychology	7 in two Science subjects
Politics	7 in a Humanities subject
Further Maths	8 in Mathematics

Choosing A Levels at KECHB

- Reformed A Levels
 - Two year courses (no AS Level)
 - Internal exam results used for UCAS predicted grades
- Most students start 3 A Levels (10+ hours' work per subject per week)
 - Some will start 4
 - Further Maths (submitted with A Level choices)
 - Contrasting subject (chosen after discussions in March)
- Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)
 - Starts in Autumn Term of Year 12

Applications to KECHB Sixth Form

- Applications will open in mid-November
 - Link to the application website will be on the school website (Home → Sixth Form → Admissions)
- Applications must be submitted before 9 am on Monday 16th January
 - You will be able to submit mock/predicted grades after that date if needed

Applications continued

- Conditional offers will be made in April
- Students who do not receive an offer will be able to reapply on results day
- We expect to welcome around 60 new students to Year 12 next year. Those students are not 'competing for places' with our current Year 11 students.
